



Duties of the State Umpire-In-Chief

The duties of the State Umpire-in-Chief (SUIC) shall be those as outlined in the official guidelines of DBB with the additional duties as follows:

The SUIC shall keep a registry of all umpires, and prior to the first tournament of the year he shall send copies to the National Coordinator(s) and the State Director. This registry shall be a source of umpires for league officials and tournament directors and shall be kept for three consecutive years for tournament qualification purposes.

The SUIC shall keep records of all District and League Umpire-in-chiefs as well as any clinicians that may have qualified and shall send a copy of these records to the National Coordinator(s).

The SUIC shall keep records of all monies received and disbursed and shall give an annual report at the State Meeting and shall send a copy to the National Coordinator(s).

The SUIC shall attend all tournaments as much as possible for the purpose of gathering information that will help in deciding qualifications for National Tournaments.

The SUIC shall be elected by the State Board of Directors at the same time as the election of the State Directors and Assistant Directors. The tenure of the office shall correspond with the other state officers.

The SUIC shall hold no other office in the organization from District level and above. He shall hold no office in any other youth baseball organization that would be considered in competition with the DBB program.

The SUIC, by virtue of this office held shall have a seat on the State Board of Directors with voice and vote. The SUIC, by virtue of this held shall have a voice and vote at the National Meeting.
